Arriving in good time and finding our spots in the foreign dignitaries robing room, robes were pulled out to air and regalia quickly sorted for ease vesting. With absences short, long standing friendships were rekindled, discussions entered renewed and new acquaintances made. With the bewitching



hour fast approaching, E Kt Scott Hunter and RE Kt Ian Harper sought out the Finnish Grand Marshal in order to prepare the Grand Priory of Germany's entrance. With little time to rehearse due to this being a meeting of two Great Priories the GPvD team were set and briefed. With temperatures hovering around 28C, we all knew we were going to have a challenging time in our regalia.

In order of precedence, all visiting delegations entered with full pomp and ceremony, with Germany being notably the largest

Templar overseas body. Our Grand Master, ME Kt Roddy MacKenzie GCT was warmly welcomed for the Finnish Head of Order and shown to his seat. Following a well understood procedure, the Grand Priory of Finland was opened which then led on to a new Grand Master being solemnly enthroned and proclaimed.



Following the investiture of Finnish Great Officers, proceedings were called off. During the interlude a light lunch and cold drinks were enjoyed by all. All too soon we were back in the Temple to be part of history in the making for the wider Order, the

The transition and handover from one Great Priory to another was gracefully conducted with the new Grand Master being enthroned, his Great Priory Banner being unfurled for the first time. With first appointments completed, the ceremony came a

timely conclusion with a well drilled closing ceremony. All Great Officers and processed out under a well drilled Estonian Arch of Steel.
